The famous Soviet and Russian scientist and musicologist Mark G. Aranovsky (1928—2009) had created the unique heritage, which is extremely important for the modern humanity sciences. Musicologists usually connect his name with some significant events in the field of musicology. Aranovsky is the author of modern musical theories, which essentially expanded the problematical spectra of traditional musical science to its horizons from an interdisciplinary perspective. The problems that Mark Aranovsky investigated are relevant for researchers who address the theory of knowledge, philosophy of mind, the mechanisms of perception, processing and description of audio/music information, all what today is determined by the concept of “cognitive science”.

The basic aim of the conference is to predict the capabilities for the consolidation of experts in various specialties and areas for sharing experience and methods to discuss the issues and problems related to:

- Mechanisms underlying the formation of a complete image, or binding of individual features into a complete image;
- Logic-and-sense grammars and spatiotemporal intuitions in verbal and non-verbal text;
- Mechanisms of perception;
- Mechanisms underlying conceptualization of time, metaphor and gesture;
- Cognitive prominence in music & language;
- Mechanisms of the formation of mental, neural and acoustic/ sound networks to predict future events (including events of musical text);
- Evolution & cognitive resources of speech and music and etc.

The conference will open on 26 September 2018 in the conference hall of the State Institute for Art Studies at 10.30.
